Membership Musings

December 2024

Oh boy. There is much to muse about this month my fellow members. Let’s just start with the elephant in the room, or in this case the Jaguar in the garage. Unless you have been enjoying a well-deserved post-election news blackout while vacationing on some tropical island, you are undoubtedly aware that Jaguar Land Rover has just launched its “new era” advertising campaign featuring a re-brand of its venerable logo and associated trade dress, as shown below.



Reaction, in automotive circles and among the general public, has been alternately bewildered, confused, dumbfounded, and/or righteously indignant. From the motoring press and social media accounts which I follow, it’s safe to say the response among Jaguar enthusiasts to the “reimagined” logo and the early advertising video has been one of uniform astonishment and disapproval. For example, an Instagram account which I follow (@jagloversitalia) provided this reaction:



Here, I’ll just observe it is entirely fitting and proper that the Italians, with their heritage of esteemed and distinctively identified automotive brands (think Ferrari prancing horse, Maserati trident, Alfa-Romeo crest with the man-eating serpent) are horrified that Jaguar would do such a thing to its leaper. In my own humble opinion, Jaguar without the leaper is like Apple without the bite out of the apple.

In the week following introduction of the “Copy Nothing” branding and the teaser video, reactions from very diverse viewers were not actually dissimilar. Jaguar took the brunt of jokes from the late night comedian circuit. Stephen Colbert mused, “Is the new Jaguar a yellow elevator that takes you to a fashion model planet made of pink dust?” (You can see the whole hilarious monologue at: https://youtu.be/-pKh23gXK2Q?si=5L1FhCOK9PV_cKJY. The Jaguar levity starts at the 7:50 minute mark.) On the other hand, conservative media seized upon the ad campaign as another example of alleged “woke” culture. Really? Well, I doubt that ideology had any role to play in the judgment of the crack Jaguar marketing team responsible for this initiative, however they have managed to become equal opportunity offenders.

Perhaps like others, I am left wondering if this campaign which has now gone super-viral, but as the object of ridicule, is just a provocative attention-getting effort, i.e., a stunt, or a real indication of what is to come. The campaign so far suggests nothing concrete about future Jaguar cars. Phrases like “Create Exuberant”, “Live Vivid”, “Break Moulds”, and “Copy Nothing” do not illuminate the new Jaguar product(s). The first glimpse of the aforementioned new Jags is to be had at a venue known as “Miami Art Week” in early December. Rather a curious choice for an unveiling, but hey, what do I know about marketing? So, it would seem that by the time you are reading this edition of the *Jaguar’s Purr*, we shall all have some more information about what’s up at Jaguar. I’m managing my expectations. Let’s just say I am hoping that Jaguar at the 2024 Mi-

ami Art Week is not as historic and memorable as Jaguar at the 1961 Geneva Automobile Show (E-Type unveiling), but historic and memorable for the wrong reasons. I'm also hoping that years from now, some professor at Harvard Business School is not using this whole "reimagining" exercise as an example of how a company takes a revered trademark and destroys the equity in its brand.

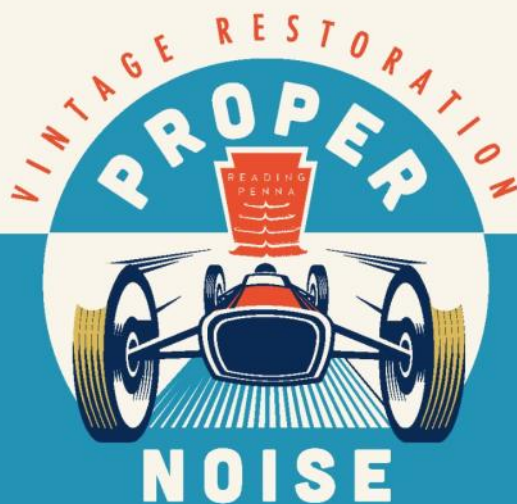

1965 S-Type 3.8, December Calendar Car

I grew up in a Jaguar family. My dad loved British cars having owned an Austin Healey bugeye Sprite, Triumph TR4A, 1960 MKII, and three E-Types, 68, 69, and 71. Although I loved the E-Types I always had a fondness for the white 1960 MKII. It was in this car that my mom took me around south Jersey shopping before I had to attend kindergarten at 5 years old. I still remember the smell of the red leather and wood interior that surrounded me on those hot summer days. See the pic of me in my mom's arms in the winter of 1960 with my older brothers in the back seat.

Fast forward forty plus years to 2004 when my wife, Sheila, was diagnosed with breast cancer at 41 and our lives changed. The next year included a double mastectomy along with aggressive chemotherapy while taking care of 3 kids 4, 7, and 10. I thought what would be better than to buy her a Jaguar to cheer her up.

In 98 Jaguar came out with the "retro" S-Type and I really liked the look of that car. The commercial that aired when it was introduced showed the retro driving down a store lined street and the reflection in the store windows was a white 60's S-Type that reminded me so much of dad's MKII when I was a kid. I searched the auction sites for a few years and found a BRG 65 S-Type on ebay. It was far from the original with a chevy V8 350 and a Tremec T-5 manual transmission. The interior was from a 94 Jaguar VDP. So, my 65 Jag got wheels in 3rd and had heated power seats.

I remember being at a DVJC breakfast when one of the members asked to see the engine. I told him proudly it had a Chevy V8 350 under the hood to which he replied....."oh, never mind then."

I drove this car for years as a daily driver until it burst into flames while I was driving it to my mechanic because I smelled fumes. I was only 200 yards from my mechanic when flames started coming out from under my dashboard. What a horrible day that was. See picture after the fire was put out.

My personalized plate "65JAG" on that car cost me over \$100 and that helped me to justify shipping my 2nd 65 Jag from Beverly Hills CA and dropped in my driveway in Malvern, PA. My wife didn't exactly agree with that logic. This 65 Jag is featured as Mr. December in the 2024 DVJC calendar. The picture in the calendar makes it look much better than it is, but I still get many compliments on it as you just don't see many of these driving around anymore. Since I purchased this car a couple years ago, I've added four new whitewall tires which I think gives it a great look with the wire wheels just like dad's when I was a kid. I also had a new burlwood dashboard shipped from England to replace the tired one. The biscuit interior seats look great. All in all, I'm so glad I have this car in my garage and I am honored to have it featured in the DVJC calendar.
